

Each ward in Hiroshima City has a *Kurashi Sapōto Sentā* ("Daily Life Support Center"). At each Center, qualified professionals help individuals who are struggling financially for reasons related to work, housing, family, and so on, by thinking of solutions to support each person's independence.

Who is eligible?

Hiroshima City residents who are struggling financially and not receiving Public Assistance (*Seikatsu Hogo*). The Centers also give advice to family members and various support organizations.

Free rubella antibody tests and vaccinations

風しんの抗体検査と予防接種を無料で実施します(P3)

As of April this year, men who have not had the opportunity to be immunized against rubella now have access to free rubella antibody tests and vaccinations

What is rubella?

Rubella (園 しん) is a highly contagious viral infection, spread mainly through coughing and sneezing. It can range broadly from causing no symptoms at all to many symptoms at once, and in some serious cases in adults can sometimes lead to hospitalization.

If a woman catches rubella in the early stages of pregnancy, it can lead to congenital rubella syndrome (CRS), which affects the baby's heart, hearing and sight among others.

Rubella can be vaccinated against. For your own health and the health of unborn babies, please get tested for rubella antibodies and get vaccinated against rubella.

Who is eligible for free tests and vaccinations?

Male residents of Hiroshima City born between April 2, 1962, and April 1, 1979

How to get tested and immunized for free

1) First, get a coupon.

Coupons are needed to access this service. In mid-April this year, Hiroshima City Hall sent them to male residents born April 2, 1972 - April 1, 1979.

The City will send coupons to other men who are eligible in future years. If you are eligible and wish to get tested and immunized now, you can apply to receive your coupon through your ward's Health Center (*Hoken Sentā*), or through Hiroshima City

Hall website (use the QR code to the right or the URL below). The website is in Japanese but has built-in machine translation services for English, Chinese, and Korean.

2) Take an antibody test.

You can be tested for immunity (a rubella antibody test) at testing sessions such as Specific Health Checkups (*Tokutei Kenshin*) or workplace checkups (*jigyōsho kenshin*). You can also do this at a medical institution contracted by the government. In either case, take your coupon and some ID to get tested. You can find details of contracted institutions (in Japanese) on the website of the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare.

3) If the test results show that you do not have a sufficient level of rubella antibodies, get immunized.

Take your coupon, test results and ID to a medical institution and get immunized. Note that you may need to book, so please contact the institution in advance.

Preventing congenital rubella syndrome (CRS)

To prevent CRS, it is important to increase the rubella immunity of society as a whole. Even if you do not know any pregnant women or are not hoping to conceive, please get tested and immunized. Hiroshima City Hall also provides free rubella antibody tests for women trying to conceive and the people who live with them. 

- © **Stamps** The When you cut stamps from envelopes, please leave 5 mm of paper around them. It is not necessary to remove them from the envelope. Torn or folded stamps cannot be accepted.
- © PET Bottle Caps To Only PET bottle caps for drinks or mineral water are accepted. Please wash the caps and tear off the sticker if it has one. This is in order to avoid damaging the recycling machines. Things such as metal caps and pull-top tabs cannot be accepted.


Trio-Phone Service

Garbage Disposal Information

Separate garbage properly and take it to the collection site by 8:30 am on the designated day. Please do NOT take garbage to the site on the night before. Garbage collection days vary depending on where you live and the category of the refuse. For further details, consult your local ward office or your neighbors to be sure of the proper disposal method. "Hiroshima 8", a handbook on how to separate garbage, and "Hiroshima City Garbage Disposal Guidelines", a garbage chart with schedules of garbage collection days, are available at ward offices, branch offices and community halls. The Handbook and Guidelines are translated into English, Spanish, Portuguese, Chinese and Korean. These are also available at the International Exchange Lounge (International Conference Center Hiroshima), so please ask the staff if you need them.
