3 things to look out for in the now fully reopened Peace Memorial Museum

On 25th April, the Main Building of the Peace Memorial Museum reopened after 5 years of renewal work. Although continuing earthquake-proofing work may make it seem from the outside like nothing has changed, the whole museum is now fully open to visitors. In this month's column I'd like to introduce three aspects of the new-and-improved museum and my feelings after visiting.

1. Remnants of the destruction

The aim of the section "Devastation on August 6th" is to make visitors feel as if they are stood in the ruins of Hiroshima just after the bombing. The focal point is a large central case (pictured), the base of

which is scattered with work clothes worn by schoolchildren killed in the bombing. I had the sense that the case is intentionally oversized, with a striking space left between the clothes as if they still lay undisturbed.

Many of the displays surrounding the central case contain objects damaged by the bomb. These include everyday items that we normally think of as sturdy and brittle, such as coins, bottles and iron girders, which were distorted by the blast and fused together by the heat. These bizarre sights conveyed to me the horrifying force and painful tragedy of an atomic bomb.

2. Human stories

"Cries of the Soul" and "To Live" are two sections of the Main Building that deal with victims and survivors respectively. "Cries of the Soul" displays belongings left behind by victims together with photographs and the words of their family members. When I visited, I felt that it was important for all three of these to be displayed together. Each heartbreaking story was made more real by seeing the face of the victim, and even more so by having an actual object from that person's life in front of me.

On the other hand, the focus of "To Live" is the stories of survivors who had to live on with the physical and emotional consequences of their experiences, such as

being forced into poverty by the inability to work. It occurred to me that those of us from outside Japan still do not know enough about this part of Hiroshima's history.

3. Temporary exhibition: drawings of the bombing

Expected to run until the end of December, this temporary exhibition can be found in the Special Exhibition Room on the East Building's first floor, and features pictures created by survivors of the atomic bombing to visually tell their stories. There are 75 pictures on display, but there are actually over 5000 such pictures in existence, created by over 1000 people. Because of this, the exhibition also features ultra-high definition (UHD) screens showing a 10 minute version of the NHK documentary *Stories Told Through A-Bomb Drawings by Survivors: Hiroshima* (with English subtitles).

Next year will mark 75 years since the atomic bombing, and Hiroshima is still thinking of new ways to commemorate the bombing and educate visitors on the realities of what happened on 6th August 1945.

Support for pregnant women and new mothers

<u>産前・産後のママを支援します</u>(P2)

The time before and after giving birth is the least stable time for a mother's physical and mental health. Hiroshima City Hall works together with professionals such as midwifes to provide support for women during this time, and has received satisfied responses from service users.

The below three services are available. In principal, all services are provided in Japanese.

1) Support before and after the birth

Before the birth, you can talk to a qualified midwife about things such as any concerns you have. After the birth, they will give you guidance on things such as breastfeeding and bathing the baby.

Who can use this service?

This service is for...

- ...women who are pregnant and have 8 weeks (56 days) or less left until the birth.
- ...women who have had a baby in the last 8 weeks (56 days).

If you are either of the above **and** you meet all of the below criteria, you and your baby can use this service:

- Your address is in Hiroshima City.
- You have health problems, parenthood-related anxiety, or similar.
- You do not know anyone who can give you advice.

Support provided

A midwife will visit your home to provide services including the following:

- Talking to you about any concerns about pregnancy or childbirth
- Checking on your (the mother's) health and guidance on breast management (nyūbō kanri)
- Advice about breastfeeding and bathing the baby
- Advice about parenting
- And others

How much does it cost? 0 to 2,500 yen per visit, depending on income and other factors

2) Support after the birth

Immediately after the birth, you can visit or stay at an obstetric medical facility to receive support for your wellbeing and ask for advice on parenting.

Who can use this service?

If you are a mother with a baby who is less than 8 weeks (56 days) old and meet all of the following criteria, you and your baby can use this service:

- Your address is in Hiroshima City.
- You have health problems, worries about parenthood, or similar.
- You cannot get help from your family with housework or childcare.

Short Stay Support: From 0 to 15,000 ven per day **Daytime Support:** From 0 to 7,500 yen per day The cost depends on your income and other factors. Even if you cancel meals, the cost will not change.

3) Home visits by a helper after the birth

You can have a helper visit your home to give necessary help with housework and childcare.

Who can use this service? The same people as 2) Support after the birth

If you are worried about waiting until the morning to see a doctor about a bruise or a cut, you will be able to see a doctor here.

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Medical subsidies for single-parent households

ひとり親家庭などの医療費の補助(P4)

Hiroshima City Hall provides medical subsidies for people living in single-parent households who live in Hiroshima City and have health insurance. The subsidies pay for part of copayments. They do not pay for meals or accommodation while staying in a hospital.

Who can use this service? People in the following or similar situations can use this service:

- A child in a single-parent household and the parent who is taking care of that child. The child can use the service until the March 31 following their 18th birthday.
- A child who is not in the care of his or her parents and that child's unmarried guardian

Note: This service has income-related criteria. Please enquire for details.

Take your *inkan* seal, health insurance card, and other documents to the Health Services and Welfare Division (*Hoken Fukushi Ka*) of your local ward office. For Higashi Ward Office, contact the Welfare Division (*Fukushi Ka*)

Now that this year's rate has been decided, Hiroshima City Hall will mail a notification to households that are enrolled in National Health Insurance on June 10 (Mon.). Each household's National Health Insurance premium will be written on their notification. The notification will be sent together with a booklet (国保のしおり) explaining the National Health Insurance system.


Trio-Phone Service

Separate garbage properly and take it to the collection site by 8:30 am on the designated day. Please do NOT take garbage to the site on the night before. Garbage collection days vary depending on where you live and the category of the refuse. For further details, consult your local ward office or your neighbors to be sure of the proper disposal method. "Hiroshima 8", a handbook on how to separate garbage, and "Hiroshima City Garbage Disposal Guidelines", a garbage chart with schedules of garbage collection days, are available at ward offices, branch offices and community halls. The Handbook and Guidelines are translated into English, Spanish, Portuguese, Chinese and Korean. These are also available at the International Exchange Lounge (International Conference Center Hiroshima), so please ask the staff if you need them.
