Traffic controls for the Peace Memorial Ceremony

Traffic controls will be enforced during the ceremony on August 6 (Tues.). The below buses will follow different routes between 6:30 am and 9:30 am.

Hiroshima bus

- ▼ Busses going to Yoshijima will go to Route 2 via City Hall (Shiyakusho-mae).
- ✓ Busses going to Kusatsu via Peace Boulevard (*Heiwa Ōdōri*) will go to Peace Boulevard from Kamiya-cho via Tokaichi.
- ✓ Express busses from Inokuchi Shako or Kogo Jutaku to JR Hiroshima Station will go to the station via Tokaichi and Kamiya-cho.

1. Current Status Report (現況 届け) for the Child Rearing Allowance

WHO: If you have applied for the allowance before 30 June 2019 and are qualified to receive it. **HOW TO SUBMIT:** Submit the current conditions report and confirmation documents to your ward office's Health and Welfare Division (*Hoken Fukushi Ka*) by August 30 (Fri).

2. Application form for the Special Grant for Single Parents

WHO: If you are a single parent, you have never been married, and you are scheduled to receive your November 2019 Child Rearing Allowance payment in January 2020.

HOW TO SUBMIT: Submit the form and family register (koseki tohon) by February 3 (Mon.), 2020, to the Health and Welfare Division (Hoken Fukushi Ka) of your ward office, or if you live in Higashi Ward, the Welfare Division (Fukushi Ka).

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Water bill exemption

水道料金、下水道使用料の減免制度があります(P4)

You can be exempted from up to the cost of 10m³ of water per month.

Your household is eligible if any of the below is true:

- 1. Your household receives Public Assistance (seikatsu hogo).
- 2. There is anyone in your household who receives government support for Japanese orphans left in China etc.
- 3. Either of the following are in your household:
 - Ø Anyone with a Certificate of Physical Disability (身体 障害者 手帳, Grade 1, 2 or 3), a

Certificate of Intellectual Disability (療育 手帳, A, A or B), or a Certificate of Health

and Welfare for People with Mental Disorders (精神 障害者 保険 福祉 手帳, Grade 1 or 2)

- Anyone who receives a Special Childrearing Allowance (*Tokubetsu Jidō Fuyō Teate*), Disability Basic Pension (*Shōgai Kiso Nenkin*), or a Disability Pension (*Shōgai Nenkin*, Grade 1 or 2)
- 4. There is anyone in your household aged 65 or older who is certified as needing care (Grade 4 or 5)
- 5. Single parent households

Note:

- For **3** and **4**, they must not be staying in a hospital or institution.
- For **3**, **4** and 5, there is an income limit.
- Some private social welfare institutions are also eligible.

HOW TO APPLY:

- Go to either: the **Sewerage Bureau**'s office for your ward or the **Public Welfare Department** of your ward office.
- Bring both your *inkan* seal and proof that you are eligible.

On August 6, at 8:15 am, at the sound of a bell rung by one representative from the bereaved families and one representative for young people, a moment of silence is observed for the deceased. At that moment, factory sirens as well as temple and church bells are rung throughout the city, and Hiroshima is deeply wrapped in prayer. On this day, the Mayor of Hiroshima delivers the Peace Declaration, addressed to the whole world, at the ceremony. People recall what happened on August 6, 1945, and in their prayers, ponder the meaning of peace.



Assisting with International Cooperation with Used Stamps & PET Bottle Caps

The International Exchange Lounge collects used stamps to assist international cooperation activities. Through the volunteer groups, JOCS*, the collected stamps are sold to collectors to raise money. - © Stamps To When you cut stamps from envelopes, please leave 5 mm of paper around them. It is not necessary to remove them from the envelope. Torn or folded stamps cannot be accepted.
- © PET Bottle Caps To Only PET bottle caps for drinks or mineral water are accepted. Please wash the caps and tear off the sticker if it has one. This is in order to avoid damaging the recycling machines. Things such as metal caps and pull-top tabs cannot be accepted.

Garbage Disposal Information

Separate garbage properly and take it to the collection site by 8:30 am on the designated day. Please do NOT take garbage to the site on the night before. Garbage collection days vary depending on where you live and the category of the refuse. For further details, consult your local ward office or your neighbors to be sure of the proper disposal method. "Hiroshima 8", a handbook on how to separate garbage, and "Hiroshima City Garbage Disposal Guidelines", a garbage chart with schedules of garbage collection days, are available at ward offices, branch offices and community halls. The Handbook and Guidelines are translated into English, Spanish, Portuguese, Chinese and Korean. These are also available at the International Exchange Lounge (International Conference Center Hiroshima), so please ask the staff if you need them.
